


Why Sonoma County?

- First vineyards planted by Russian and Spanish in the early 1800s
- 85% of vineyards are family-owned

To the west is the Pacific Ocean (sea level)




Defining Boundaries of Sonoma County

To the east are the Mayacamas Mountains
(1,435 meters of elevation)



Climate & Temperature

- Sonoma County's growing season has sunny days and almost no rain May through September.
- Summer average high temperatures range from 21°C to 32°C.
- Cool evening temperatures range from 4.5°C to 10°C.



Fog & Marine Influence

- The Pacific Ocean provides a cooling maritime influence, which cools the western and southern regions of Sonoma County.
- Daily summer fog patterns are ideal for cool-climate varieties.



Distinct Soils

Sonoma County's geological history has resulted in:

- 11 major formation types
- 31 different soil series within those types
- innumerable permutations with each series.
